it'll have to be exposed to some light for some amount of time. Often museum glass and conservation glass are the best protectors of valuable documents from UV Rays.

Restoration and conservation requires different procedures and products depending on the medium. Paper restoration is one of the more delicate mediums, but it can be done with precision and care. It's important to know the right tools and services when seeking the restoration of a valuable document, map, art on paper, or other similar item.
